SLANG TERMS USED IN THE EXPENDABLES 3 MOVIE DIRECTED BY PATRICK HUGES

Abstract

Slang can not only be found in daily conversation but it also can be found in literary work such as movies, for example in The Expendables 3 Movie which the characters' use slang quite often in dialogues. The purpose of this paper is to study the function, type, and meaning of the slang terms used by the characters of The Expendables 3 movie. The researchers used descriptive qualitative method to analyze. After doing the analysis, the researchers found fifty-five slang terms and the details are as follows: (1) There are two types of slang, namely primary and secondary slang. The type which more often used is primary slang. (2) There are three types of functions: social, psychological and rhetorical functions (3) There are seven types of meaning of slang namely connotative, social, affective, collocative, conceptual, thematic and reflection meanings. Connotative meaning is the most common

INTRODUCTION

In daily interaction, people often use a slang as a way to express themselves to become friendly to someone or to show that they belong to a certain group of people. Slang is the new language which appears in this society. People use certain signs, words, phrases or sentences to convey secrets that no one should know as (Yule, 2017) states, "Slang can be used by those inside a group who share ideas and attitudes as a way of distinguishing themselves from others." Slang is a kind of informal language commonly used in a daily conversation. As part of human language to interact with each other, mostly slang expressions happen naturally and without thinking (Umam, 2020). Slang is developing along with the cultural development in the society, so that it has no time limit, place or community background. The use of slang is really popular. In this era, slang can be easily found not only in a daily conversation but it also can be found in many literary works, such as books, articles, songs, movie and so on. In this case, the researchers choose a movie as an object to analyze, the movie entitled *The Expendables 3* to be exact. The reason for choosing *The Expendables 3* is because the researchers found many slang terms used quite

The researchers are interested in research because the researchers find often slang term literary works such as movies and it is hard to understand because the words are unfamiliar. The purpose of this study is to analyze slang such as the function, the type and the meaning of it and the result of the research is additional information about new English words.

In conducting this research, the researcherss found several relevant underlying statements and theories about slang. The first statement is from (Aulia & Djatmika, 2018) state, "Slang is an informal style of speech, which may be a single word, phrases or sentences. It is created and used by a particular community. Slang is like any other part of languages; it is changing over time from one generation of the users of slang to the next generation" based on the statement slang is a term created and used by a particular community and it is changing over time. The statement is supported by (Jakob, 2018) he states, "Slang changes its identity along with who is speaking. What is slang to one person, to another is not, depending on the person's educational, economic, or social position, and even in relation to the location and generation. Slang also changes over time and can disappear rapidly" based on the statement, slang changes its identity depends on whose speaker and certain social variable of the speakers.

The third statement is from (Dewi & Suastra, 2018) who state, "Slang is considered a very informal word or expression that is commonly used in our everyday conversation. Even though the use of slang is really popular nowadays, in the past slang was often associated with vulgar words that were considered nonstandard language." based on the statement, the researchers points out slang is not appropriate to be spoken or written in a formal situation such as in the school, university, or in the office because of the informality and slang often conveys a sarcastic, even offensive, no-nonsense attitude.

From the three statements above, the researchers conclude that slang is an informal expression not appropriate to be spoken or written in a formal situation created and used by a particular community, commonly used in everyday conversation.

Slang is mostly used in speech rather than in writing, usually in a daily conversation. Slang is used in a different place, situation, every culture, and region have different slang language. Slang words spread worldwide due to many factors. Usually, people learn slang words from entertainment media such as songs, novels, and movies.

For the approach of the analysis, the researchers use three theories from the experts. The first theory is from (Leech, 1981) who distiguish the type of meaning into seven types:

- 1. Conceptual meaning which is the most basic of a word or the constant, literal meaning of a word and also dictionary definition that universally shared among society.
- 2. Connotative Meaning which the meaning of the word what it refers to depends on how the speaker uses and perceives a word. That can be said the meaning of a word depends on personal interpretations.
- 3. Social Meaning also called stylistic meaning. The social meaning is a conveyor of expression about certain social characteristics to establish and regulate social relations and to maintain social roles.
- 4. Affective Meaning conveys about personal feelings or the attitudes of the speaker or the researchers, it shows often through conceptual, connotative, and stylistic content of word used.
- 5. Reflected meaning is a meaning whereby the word has more than one meaning or it implies the word has multiple conceptual meanings.
- 6. Collocative Meaning occurs when a word collocates with another certain word.
- 7. Thematic Meaning is the meaning of expression by the speaker or the researchers by how they communicate the meaning or message in this context the arrangement, focus, and emphasize the word.

The researchers use online dictionary such as urbandictionary.com and dictionary.com or the offline dictionary such as The Routledge Dictionary of Modern American Slang and Unconventional English, The Oxford Dictionary of

The second theory is from (Chapman, 2007) who divide slang into two types:

a. Primary Slang

Primary slang is the speech of subcultural members. it sounds very natural to its speakers; it seems the speakers might be mute without it. This type is found often in teenage talks or speech of urban street gangs and it is used as a general

expression by people in daily communication.

b. Secondary Slang

Secondary slang is chosen not so much to fix one group as to express one's attitude agreement or disagreement and resourcefulness. Secondary slang used as a matter of stylistic choice and it also used to express something secretly because it is only used by restricted people who understand the meaning of the word. For example, ching chong, coke. And the last theory is from (Widawski, 2015), according

to him the function of slang is divided into four main functions:

a. Social Functions

The social functions of slang include: Identification, slang is used to distinguish specific groups within society and to identify members of these groups. Rebellion, slang is used to oppose the established authority or to distance oneself from it. Interaction, slang is used for purely social interaction, it occurs in conversation to establish a mood and maintain or ending social contact rather than for the mere exchange of information. Secrecy, Slang is used by such groups as criminals or teenagers who often find a shared vocabulary unknown to outsiders

an effective way to keep information secret.

b. Psychological Functions

The choice of a slang expression is often motivated by psychological processes in people's minds. It includes: the expression of emotions states and

reactions such as satisfaction, anger or annoyance, indifference, surprise, positive or

negative emotive categorization. Humor which can instantly reduce the solemnity,

haughtiness, or excessive seriousness of a conversation and also function to make

c. Rhetorical functions

Slang can be functioned as the manipulation for the desired effect. There are four functions of slang that includes as rhetorical function: Informality, the use of slang always diminishes the formality of communication. Stylization, slang serves to create one's image: it becomes an outward characteristic of the users and reflects their personalities. Conciseness, slang is used to communicate more quickly, easily, and effectively than standard ones. Forcefulness, slang is used often to make conversation more direct, vivid, personal and expressive, and thus more forceful than are words from the standard lexicon. It usually avoids sentimentality, diplomacy,

d. Cultural functions

The use of certain expressions often carries with it specific information which is culture-specific or culture-creative, here are parts of cultural functions: wordplay, slang is sometimes created and used for the mere pleasure of novelty and freshness derived from verbal experimentation. Word battle, another function of slang is the tradition of verbal battle which quasi-mocking exchanges of verbal communication between two or more participants, frequently involving ritual insults. Assimilation that slang from another community or even country can be assimilated into another community or country.

METHODOLOGY

The researchers use the descriptive qualitative method for the analysis. According to (Creswell & Creswell, 2018), "Qualitative approaches to data collection, analysis, interpretation, and report writing differ from the traditional, quantitative approaches. Purposeful sampling, collection of open-ended data, analysis of text or images (e.g., pictures), representation of information in figures and tables, and personal interpretation of the findings all inform qualitative methods." According to (Dewi & Suastra, 2018) "Descriptive means that the data were analyzed in words or sentences descriptively." The statement from (Creswell & Creswell, 2018) and (Dewi

To create this paper, the researchers do some procedures with the following

steps. First, the researchers find the movie which is perfect to be used as the object of

the paper and the researchers chooses The Expendables 3 movie. Second, the

researchers set limitations to the research. In this case, the researchers decide to use a

movie script. Third, the researchers focus on the main source of data which is the

script in *The Expendables 3* movie. Then, the researchers download the movie,

watched it, listens to the script intently, and writes down the slang term which can be

found in the movie. To double-check, the researchers also downloads the English

movie subtitle. Lastly, after finishing all the data- collecting, the researchers find other

supported sources such as books, journals or articles to sustain my research logically

and rationally.

FINDING AND DISCUSSION

Based on the data analysis of *The Expendables 3* movie, the researchers found

51 slang terms used on the dialogue among the characters of the movie which is

divided into two types of slang: Primary and Secondary slang. Below is a discussion

of the slang that can be found on the dialogue among the characters of the

expendables 3 movie:

1. The Type of slang

a. Primary Slang

The terms below identified as a primary slang because the terms can be

found and commonly used as a general expression in a daily communication. Here

are the example of slang terms that identified as primary slang:

2. The Function of Slang

The researchers uses (Widawski, 2015) theory to identify the function of slang terms used by the characters of *The Expendables 3* movie based on the context of the dialogue and the movie scene. The result is as follows:

a. Social functions

Social functions of slang include identification, rebellion, interaction and secrecy but the researchers found some slang terms in *The Expendables 3* movie only used as identification and interaction not as rebellion and secrecy. Here the explanation,

1. Identification

The slang term has a function as identification because the term is used to address someone. The slang term that found in *The Expendables 3* movie with this function are <u>brother</u>, <u>man</u>, <u>medical genius</u>, <u>pal</u>.

2. Interaction

Slang has a function to facilitate social interaction for establishing a mood and maintaining or ending social contact rather than for the mere

b. Psychological functions

Slang language serves a social function, but it is also linked with people thoughts and feeling. It indicates slang term has psychological functions include to express people's emotions, humor and toughness. The researchers found some slang terms in *The Expendables 3* movie as an expression of emotions and humor but the researchers do not find slang term that shown toughness, as analyzed below.

1. Emotions

One of the functions of slang is to express people's emotions such as anger or annoyance, Indifference, surprise and positive or negative emotive categorization the terms with this function can be found in *The Expendables 3* movie, the terms are <u>ass</u>, <u>assholes</u>, <u>badass</u>, <u>damn</u>, <u>don't give a fuck</u>, <u>fucked up</u>, <u>goddammit</u>, grandpa', pussies, shit, shitheads, the hell.

2. Humor

Slang can also be used to express humor including making sarcastic or ironic comments. The researchers found one slang term with this function in *The Expendables 3* movie such as sucking on your daddy's titty.

c. Rhetorical functions

Slang can be functioned as the manipulation for the desired effect. The rhetorical motives behind the use of slang include informality, stylization, conciseness and forcefulness of expression. The researchers found some slang terms have this function, as analyzed below.

1. Informality

The use of slang always diminishes the formality of communication. Slang lends a vivid color to content matter which may be serious or contrite. The researchers found some slang terms with this function in *The Expendables 3* movie such as bullshit, dropped, got you, shitstorm, tags, trippin', shot, window.

2. Stylization

Stylization is another function of slang. Slang often use to identify with a style or an attitude and to create one's image. There are some slang terms found as a stylization in *The Expendables 3* movie such as bitch, booze, eyes in the sky, flock, nerd, shithole, the knife, don't pop the bottles yet, hole, pulled the plug.

3. Conciseness

Slang expressions are used not only because they are concise but also because it makes people communicate more quickly, easily, and effectively than standard ones. The slang terms found in *The Expendables 3* movie with this function are 'bout, 'em, creds, gimme, givin', gonna, gotta, next-gen, and wanna.

4. Forcefulness

Slang is often more direct, vivid, personal and expressive, and thus more forceful than are words from the standard lexicon. There are three of slang terms used in *The Expendables 3* movie shown forcefulness such as <u>arse</u>, <u>ass</u>, and son of a bitch.

d. Cultural functions

The use of certain expressions often carries with it specific information which is culture-specific or culture-creative. Cultural functions consist of three functions there are word play, word battle and assimilation. The researchers did not find any slang term with cultural functions used in *The Expendables 3* movie.

Based on the table above, the 51 slang terms that found in *The Expendables 3* movie have 6 types of meanings: there are 16 slang terms that have connotative meaning, 14 slang terms with social meaning, 9 slang terms have affective meaning, 4 slang terms have collocative meaning, 11 slang terms have conceptual meaning, and 3 slang terms have thematic meaning.

CONCLUSION

From the analysis that has been done about slang terms used by the characters of *The Expendables 3* movie, the researchers conclude that there are 51 slang terms found in *The Expendables 3* movie. The slang terms divided into two types: primary slang and secondary slang. Besides the type of slang, the researchers also found three out of four types of functions of slang terms used in the movie using (Widawski, 2015) theory. The first type is the social function which means the slang terms used as identification and interaction. Second, psychological functions, the slang terms used as an expression of emotion and humor. Third, Rhetorical functions which mean the slang terms used as informality, stylization, conciseness, and forcefulness. Each slang term has a meaning or some of the terms that used multiple times have more than one meaning depends on the context of the dialogue and the movie scene.
